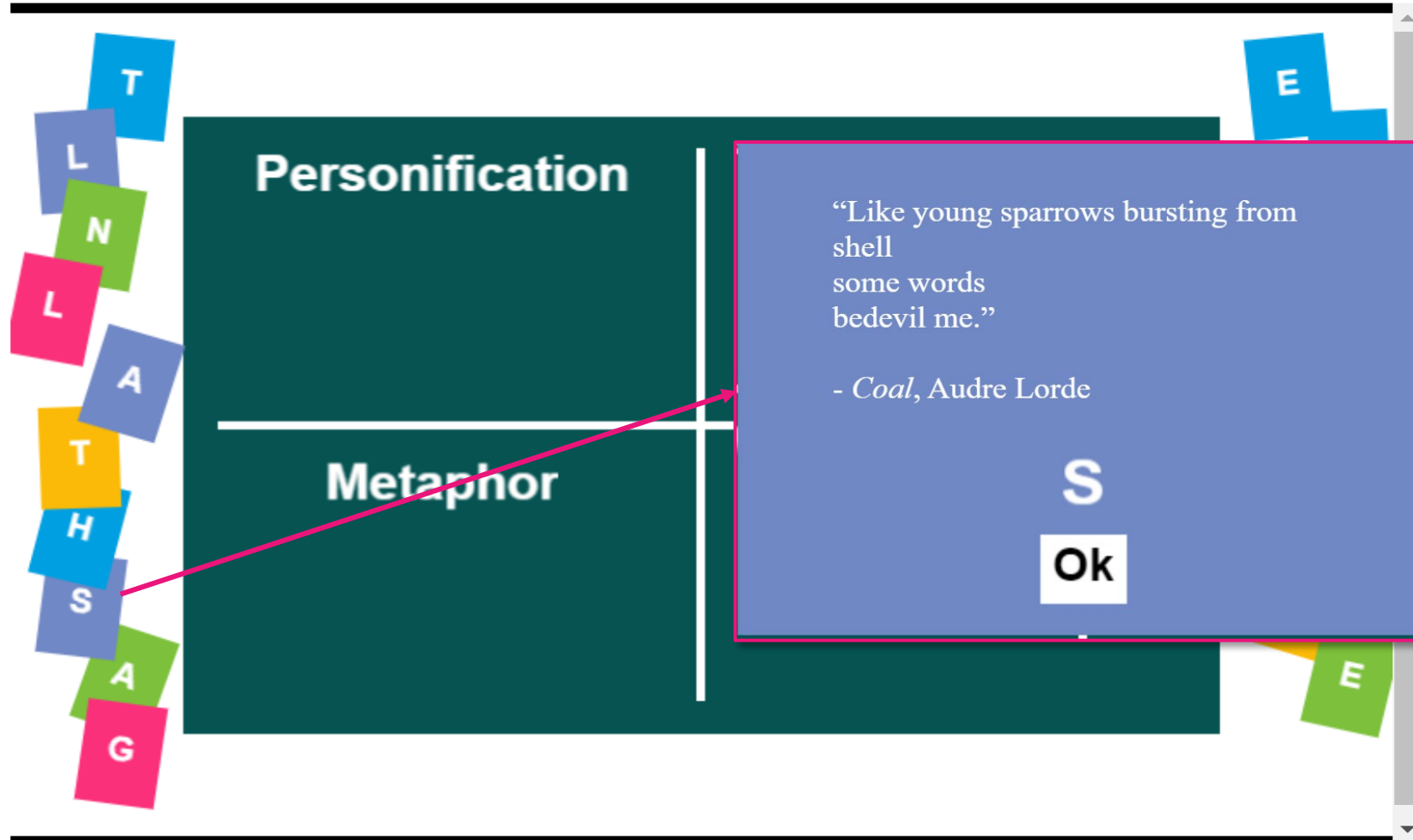


COLLABORATIVE REVIEW ACTIVITY
